

Singapore Chinese Orchestra

Inaugurated in 1997, the 75-strong Singapore Chinese Orchestra (SCO) is Singapore's only professional Chinese orchestra as well as a flagship local arts group. Taking on the twin role of preserving traditional arts and culture and establishing new frontiers through the incorporation of exotic Southeast Asian cultural artefacts, its home is the Singapore Conference Hall, a prime performance venue in the financial district. These factors, together with the patronage of Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong, have made SCO an outstanding and unique orchestra.

Since its inception, SCO has impressed a broadening audience base with its blockbuster presentations and is fast establishing itself among the other counterparts in the world. In 2002, it staged a symphonic fantasy epic Marco Polo and Princess Blue as part of the opening festival of Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay. The following year, it engaged in a musical and visual conversation with Singapore's most eminent multi-disciplinary artist Tan Swie Hian at the Singapore Arts Festival 2003. The Orchestra celebrated Singapore's 30th National Day in 2004 with a spectacular concert - Our People, Our Music - featuring over 2,300 local music enthusiasts at the Singapore Indoor Stadium. In 2005, it produced a mega musical production, Admiral of the Seven Seas, as part of the Singapore Arts Festival 2005. The Orchestra again displayed its versatility in its collaboration with the Singapore Dance Theatre at the Singapore Arts Festival 2006. In 2007, SCO was part of the 240-strong combined orchestra that performed at the Singapore National Day Parade. In the Singapore Arts Festival 2008, SCO joined hands with Theatreworks to present the groundbreaking production Awaking, which brought together Kunqu opera music and Elizabethan music.

In August 2009, SCO made history by becoming the first Chinese orchestra to perform in the opening week of the Edinburgh Festival.

Known for its high performance standards, the SCO has been invited to perform at such prestigious events as the World Economic Forum and International Summit of Arts Council in 2003, and the 2006 International Monetary Fund (IMF) Annual Meeting. The orchestra also toured Beijing, Shanghai and Xiamen in 1998 and Taiwan in 2000. In 2005, it performed at the Budapest Spring Festival, the Singapore Season in London and Gateshead. In October 2007, the SCO performed at the Beijing Music Festival, as well as in Shanghai as part of the Singapore Season in the China Shanghai International Arts Festival, It was also invited to perform at the Macau International Music Festival, as well as at major concert halls in Guangzhou, Zhongshan and Shenzhen. Such stints enabled the SCO to showcase its talents, propelling it to the forefront of the international music arena.

In line with its aim of being an orchestra for everyone, SCO reaches out to the masses through its outdoor concerts at national parks, schools and heartlands. SCO also commissions its own compositions and in 2006, organised its first music composition competition that featured contestants incorporating musical elements from Southeast Asia. It is with this vision that SCO continues to inspire, influence, educate and communicate through its music.

Quek Ling Kiong – Conductor

Quek Ling Kiong is a 2002 Singapore Young Artist Award recipient. He studied at the Shanghai Conservatory of Music under the National Arts Council's (NAC) Overseas Scholarship, as well as the Lee Foundation and Singapore Hokkien Huay Kuan scholarships. He learned Chinese percussion from renowned master Professor Li Min Xiong and Western classical percussion from Professor Xue Bao Lun. He also explored various Chinese percussion arts with masters such as Professor Li Zhen Gui. An Zhi Shun and Zhu Xiao Lin. After graduating from the Conservatory in 1997, he joined the Singapore Chinese Orchestra (SCO) and became its Percussion Principal.

Ling Kiong also learned conducting from Cultural Medallion recipient Tay Teow Kiat and famed Chinese conductor, Professor Xia Fei Yun. He attended the workshops and master classes of such luminaries as Maestros Tsung Yeh, Kirk Trevor, Colin Metters and Harold Farberman as well as Professors Johannes Schlaefli, Marc Kissoczy, Oleg Proskumya and Leonid Korchmar.

Ling Kiong's career in professional conducting took off when he became SCO's first Conducting Assistant in 2003. In 2004, he became the Assistant Conductor of SCO and the Conductor of the Singapore Youth Chinese Orchestra (SYCO). In 2005, he debuted with SCO at the opening concert of the 12th International Conference of WASBE (World Association for Symphonic Band and Ensembles). In 2006, he led SYCO to perform at the International Arts Festival in Tainan, Taiwan.


Besides conducting orchestras in China and Hong Kong, Ling Kiong has conducted symphony orchestras in the Czech Republic including Westbohmisches Symphonie-orchester in Marienbad, Karlovy Vary Symphony Orchestra and Berg Komorni Orchestra of Prague. In September 2006, he was again awarded the NAC overseas bursary and scholarship from Hokkien Huay Kuan to pursue conducting studies in Zurich, Switzerland. He obtained his Diploma in Advanced Studies from Zürcher Hochschule der Künste in 2007. Upon his return to SCO in 2008, Ling Kiong was promoted to Associate Conductor.

Ling Kiong is currently an adjunct teacher for the Singapore School Of The Arts and the Singapore Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts.





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
